Building works have now started at our Norwich base to renovate and extend our HQ, making sure we are fit to fly 24/7 from Norwich from early 2021.

The new office space will also enable us to have state-of-the-art training facilities for our crew, larger office space to future proof our organisation and a brilliant community hub, where we will be able to deliver even more CPR training.

One of the hugely important aspects of this development is that EAAA has become a property owner for the first time, meaning we are developing a real asset for the charity and will become more efficient and sustainable going forward.

Purchasing the land for our Norwich operation and the building works for the new and improved base will cost almost £7 million, but thanks to generous legacy donations which have been prudently invested by our savvy Trustees, we have been able to plan and pay for this out of our reserves.

So, from all of us at EAAA, we'd like to say a huge **thank you** to everyone who has supported us and helped us to get to this very exciting point in our history.

A FULLY 24/7 OPERATION BY RAPID Response vehicle from March 2020

Thanks to the arrival of two new Volvo XC90 rapid response vehicles (RRVs), we are extremely pleased to announce that we are now fully 24/7 by car from both of our bases.

This means we can deliver the same level of expertise, equipment and care as we provide on the helicopter 24/7 from Norwich and Cambridge, by car, for the very first time. One of the RRVs was fully funded by a one-off government grant, the other was kindly funded by our supporters and two charitable trusts.

In Autumn 2019 we went 24/7 on the RRV with a doctor and critical care paramedic (CCP) from Norwich seven days a week, and are very pleased to be able to now roll this out in Cambridge from March.

Andrew Downes, CCP and Head of Service Improvement and Clinical Quality, said: "The demand for our RRV night crews in Norwich has provided us with crucial evidence that we need to provide a 24/7 helicopter operation for the region, but also that the RRV is in itself an excellent way to quickly get our highly-skilled teams to patients when the helicopter is offline or when it is quicker to travel by road than by air during the day."

In 2019 we attended 961 missions by RRV, with 593 of these at night.

REPHILL TRIAL.

Andrew needed an urgent blood transfusion

EAAA is proud to be part of the RePHILL Trial, run by the University of Birmingham, the first clinical trial of its kind in the UK to study the pros and cons of giving blood to trauma patients pre-hospital.

As blood is a valuable and limited resource, the trial is needed to understand more about how blood is used and provide evidence-based data about the types of patients who benefit most. The trial will also look at if more or less blood is required in total if blood is given at-scene versus in hospital.

To prevent biased results, the blood boxes are randomly packed so that some contain blood and some contain saline, salty water solution. The team do not know which product they have before they decide to give blood.

Since joining the trial in 2018, EAAA have recruited 81 patients to the trial, one of them was Andrew Walker.

ndrew Walker, 56 from Diss, is one of the EAAA patients who needed blood and has contributed to the RePHILL trial. A keen motorcyclist, Andrew has been donating blood for almost twenty years and has donated more than 34 times.

In August, Andrew was on his way home from Diss train station after a night shift when he collided with a stationary car. He went into the handlebars of his scooter and suffered major internal injuries. The ambulance crew that were first on scene quickly radioed for the air ambulance as they could see that Andrew was losing a lot of blood and needed critical care.

Anglia One, flown by pilots Steve Norris and Rob Gleave, carrying Doctor Nicola Ebbs and Critical Care Paramedic (CCP) Rod Wells, was activated at 08:31, 19 minutes after the 999 call was made, and were on scene just 17 minutes after being tasked.

CCP Rod used the ultrasound to check Andrew for internal bleeding and the team quickly determined that Andrew needed a blood transfusion; a potentially lifesaving procedure that EAAA can provide at scene. Doctor Nicola sedated Andrew to help manage his pain and to assist with his breathing and started the blood transfusion.

Andrew was then flown to the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital for emergency surgery. He had ruptured his spleen and liver and had major internal bleeding. Andrew's spleen was removed, and he was admitted to intensive care for several days. In total, he was in hospital for almost two weeks, but soon was able to continue his recovery at home.

Andrew said: "I'm so grateful to the ambulance and air ambulance teams who treated me and made sure that I received the very best care. I feel very lucky that my injuries weren't worse, and I have been able to recover relatively quickly with the help of my family. Being a regular blood donor, you go and give blood with never a thought that one day you may need it yourself. I would always encourage anyone that can give blood to do so."

We are grateful for the Norfolk Blood Bike charity who deliver the blood to our base every day.

AVIATION AREA. What its like to fly for EAAA

We asked Martin Polding, one of the Captains at the Cambridge base and Regional Manager for all of our pilots, what it's like to fly for EAAA.

What do you like most about helicopters?

From the very first time I tried, unsuccessfully, to hover a helicopter - I knew it was the job for me. I enjoy that feeling of freedom you get and being able to come to a hover and land practically anywhere.

What's the hardest part of the job?

From a professional standpoint, the hardest part of the job is flying night missions. There is a higher level of risk at night, particularly avoiding hazards such as power lines and masts. We use state of the art night vision goggles to help mitigate the risks, but it still requires a high degree of concentration and discipline.

What's your favourite part of the job?

The best bits of the job for me are working as part of a close-knit team and getting out and about helping people in the community. The job never gets old and every mission has its own unique set of challenges.



Tell us something we wouldn't know about the helicopter?

When fully loaded, the helicopter is about as heavy as an adult male hippopotamus and it uses roughly 320 litres of fuel per flying hour (which is about six full tanks of petrol in a typical car).

How did you train to be a pilot?

I joined the Royal Navy as a helicopter pilot in 1992. A lot of helicopter pilots begin their flying careers in the military but there are other routes into the profession and we have some pilots at EAAA who have self-funded their pilot training.

CLINICAL CORNER. The Butterfly IR

ur Clinical teams have been trialling the latest portable ultrasound device: the Butterfly IQ, which has only recently become available in the UK.

Ultrasound uses high-frequency sound waves to create images of the inside of the body and can be a vital diagnostic tool. The Butterfly IQ portable ultrasound connects to a phone or tablet to display high-resolution ultrasound images and video, making it incredibly easy to use in the pre-hospital environment. The device has also been tested by our engineers to certify that it is safe to use in-flight, so it has also been used whilst flying at 1200ft and 160 mph! The ultrasound images and video can be uploaded to a secure cloud folder, allowing quick expert review of the images to aid diagnosis and treatment. This has been of huge benefit to our crews in aiding interpretation of ultrasounds and helping our patients to get fast, definitive treatment.

Doctor Jon Barratt, who has been leading on the trial, said: "It's amazing to see how quickly this technology is advancing and for us to see how it can be maximised in the pre-hospital environment. Being able to quickly share the images with colleagues has been of huge benefit to the team. The better the equipment we have, the more we can do for our patients before they get to hospital. "



We have made some changes to our policies and terms and conditions which are important for you to know about. A new cap of 10 plays per week has been implemented for any players of our weekly lottery and you must be 18 years or over to play. We have also increased the first payment for new lottery players to £5 from £4.34, in order to cover a five week month so no draws are missed.

I've really enjoyed my time with EAAA so far and can't wait to help build this great charity even more, but we couldn't do any of it without your help. So, I would like to take the opportunity to personally say thank you to all of our lottery and raffle players, for all that you have done for EAAA so far.

New for 2020!

Bedfordshire Sat 5 September

Our Norfolk Trek 24 event last year was so popular we are organising a brand new event on the other side of the region!

THE MCQUEEN CHARTER. Putting mental health first

Inspired by the late air ambulance doctor, Dr Carl McQueen, the McQueen Charter is a new initiative which aims to improve mental health and wellbeing in the workplace by helping employers to put mental health first and create safe, positive and open environments where staff feel able to discuss their mental health and supported to access help, if needed.

Dr Carl McQueen died by suicide in 2016. His wife, Kirsty, has since created this charter with the help of Sarah Atkins at EAAA to make it easier for others to address their mental health and wellbeing. Originally designed as a helicopter emergency medical service (HEMS) specific tool, the Charter's principles can be applied to any workplace to encourage upfront policies and conversations about mental health.

The Charter has been trialled at EAAA with great impact; more than 25% of staff are now certified mental health first aiders and the charity now offers Wellbeing Days which can be taken at short notice by any member of staff who feels they need to take a day to focus on their mental health.
