WHAT IS THE PHONETIC ALPHABET?

It is a set of spelling words used instead of letters and each word begins with the letter it replaces. You have probably made up your own version, like "A is for apple, B is for boat", etc.

WHY WAS IT CREATED?

The phonetic alphabet was created to help to clearly communicate critical information verbally, particularly over radios and telephones by spelling out key terms using an internationally recognised system.

WHEN WAS IT CREATED?

The version of the phonetic alphabet we use today, known as the NATO phonetic alphabet, was adopted in 1956. It is the 4th known version, with the first created during the 1920s.
